

- **5. Digital Archiving:** Implement secure digital storage for recordings to preserve their integrity and evidentiary value.
- **6. Operational Reliability:** Ensure surveillance systems remain operational during power outages with backup solutions like UPS.
- 7. Immediate Access: Ensure recordings are accessible for regulatory inspections and law enforcement, both on-site and potentially off-site.
- **8. Compliance Monitoring:** Regularly audit surveillance systems to ensure they meet regulatory standards for placement, functionality and data storage.
- **9. Security Measures:** Secure surveillance equipment to prevent unauthorized access or tampering, including encryption of archived footage.
- **10. Documentation and Training:** Maintain clear policies and train staff on surveillance protocols, including handling and retrieval of recordings.


